during the Coronavirus Pandemic

I invite you to join with me and say these prayers wherever you are at noon each day, to pray for our parishes, our home areas and our world.

*Say these prayers slowly and reflectively. Take a moment to be still in the Lord's presence. Choose to give this time completely to Him. If a couple are saying these prayers together, split the prayer up – one to read the **bold** words etc*

Be still and know that I am God.

(Psalm 46:10a NLT)

My God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield, the power that saves me, and my place of safety.

(Psalm 18:2)

We come to You as the sun rides high

To pause and give You glory.

We invite You into the middle of our day.

May Your rest be upon us.

Come Holy Spirit.

We hand every burden over to You now and thank You for Your prevailing peace.

My soul finds rest in God; My hope comes from him.

He is my rock and my salvation, he is my fortress; I shall not be shaken.

Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your heart to him; for God is our refuge.

(Psalm 62:5-8)

Now be still and hand any thoughts, cares or concerns over to the Lord and invite Him to be Lord over the situation.

**Lord Jesus Christ, we ask you to protect us from the spread of the coronavirus.
You are powerful and merciful; let this be our prayer -**

“Have mercy on me, my God, have mercy on me, for in you I take refuge. I will take refuge in the shadow of your wings until the disaster has passed.” (Psalm 57:1)

Comfort and heal them, and restore them to health and strength

Pause to lift up individuals who are ill to God in the silence...

In their anxiety, be their hope;
In their darkness, be their light**

Pause to lift up to God those on your heart who are isolated or anxious...

**Gracious God, give skill, sympathy and resilience to all who are caring for the sick, and supernatural insight to those searching for a cure.
Give wisdom to leaders across the globe that they may make the right decisions and lead wisely at this time**

Pause to lift up individual leaders or health workers to God...

Father of all, we come before you as your church. May we be the church you call us to be in this season. May we shine like a beacon of hope and love to our communities, and may you strengthen us, corporately and individually, to minister your grace and love at this time.

Pause to lift up the churches across the benefice – our churches in Powick, Callow End, Guarlford and Madresfield and across to Worcester and Malvern and their leaders, and the national and global church and their leaders at this time...

**We offer you our prayers, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.
