The Vicar's Blog

As soon as they left the synagogue, they entered the house of Simon and Andrew, with James and John. Now Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they told him about her at once. He came and took her by the hand and lifted her up. Then the fever left her, and she began to serve them.

That evening, at sunset, they brought to him all who were sick or possessed with demons. And the whole city was gathered around the door. And he cured many who were sick with various diseases and cast out many demons; and he would not permit the demons to speak, because they knew him.

In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, 'Everyone is searching for you.' He answered, 'Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do.' And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons. (A reading from Mark 1 vv New Revised Standard Version)

After his teaching in the synagogue the previous day and the healing of a man, we now get a really beautiful, homely, incident reported in Mark's Gospel as he kickstarts his account of Jesus's earthly ministry. Jesus returns to Peter's home and finds that the latter's mother-in-law (so Peter was married or a widower!) has a fever. Jesus may well have been tired after a busy day, yet he stops to heal her, and as if to prove how well she is she gets up off her bed to serve her guests a meal. By evening the sick of the whole town arrive at their door asking Jesus to heal them, which he does.

We often use the term "time out" to refer to anyone who just needs a break, or a child might be given time out to chill out: maybe they lost out in a game or a sporting competition. To them it can seem like the end of the world, but if we adults can't encourage them to see that winning and losing is all part of life, then they will make particularly unpleasant adults in the future. "Time out" can also mean sitting on the "naughty step" or "going to your room" in order to calm down. I have to do that all the time - just ask Alison!

But for Jesus "time out" was a way to refresh his spiritual batteries and his power. We know that before each great act in his life he spent time with God in prayer, and throughout the three years of his ministry healing left him depleted in power. Look at the story of the woman with a haemorrhage where this is also mentioned. So it is that the next morning Jesus gets up early to find quiet space to be with God in prayer.

We too need to refresh our spiritual batteries as often as we can by spending quiet time with God. How can you plan to do this as a regular pattern? Was this a new year resolution you are struggling to keep already? *Every blessing to you and yours - Rev Gary*







Churches Together in Malvern will be hosting the Christian Unity Service at St Joseph's RC Church on the 21st of January at 4pm.


Refreshments will be available from 3.45pm
